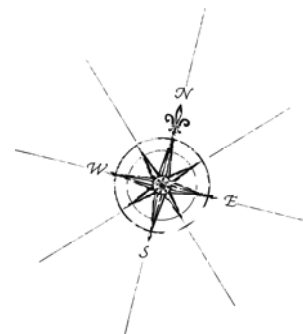

Who We Are

Pilgrim Pines Camp and Conference Center offers uniquely “blended” programming—simultaneous intergenerational and special needs camping for the developmentally disabled. Pilgrim Pines is owned and operated by the Southern California Nevada Conference United Church of Christ, a member of the United Church of Christ Outdoor Ministry Association, and is fully accredited by the American Camp Association.

Location and Accommodations

A mile high in elevation, Pilgrim Pines Camp and Conference Center is located on 150 acres in the San Bernardino Mountains, above Yucaipa and Beaumont. Located in the quaint village of Oak Glen, the camp is surrounded by apple orchards, oak trees, ponderosa pines and the chaparral environment of the mountain-side. Pilgrim Pines is an ideal place for discovery and renewal. The cabins are divided into two rooms, each equipped with three bunks, cabinets, and a bathroom with toilet and sink. Shower facilities are centrally located in each of the three residential camp areas.



Our Talented Camp Staff

are dedicated volunteers who share their time and talents each summer. All staff receive training in order to develop the best possible programming and leadership skills to enhance campers personal growth and spiritual foundation. Summer Camp Program Directors

prepare daily programs designed to meet the needs of each age and ability group. Programming is based on the ecumenical Outdoor Ministry curriculum produced by the National Council of Churches. The curriculum focuses on bible stories and works with issues of social and environmental justice and living within a multi-cultural, open and affirming community. The Directors of the Outdoor, Aquatics, Arts, and Music programs work with Summer Camp Directors to focus on building a supportive learning community.

Volunteer Counselors

are the backbone of our camping program. They are a diverse group of people who work with campers in cabins and during program time. They are trained in CPR, first aid, and working with children and people with abilities and disabilities. Our counselor to camper ratio is 1:5, one counselor for every five campers.

Counselors-in-Training (C.I.T.s)

ages 16 and 17 are placed in the cabins with an adult counselor after completing a weeklong special training session.

Health Center Staff

are on duty 24 hours a day, every week of camp.

Pastors at Camp

are invited each week to be our ‘minister in residence’. They come to support campers, counselors, and staff through involvement in the camp programs and benefit all with pastoral care.

Week 1: Counselor-in-Training (C.I.T.)

Youth aged 16 and 17 attending C.I.T. week will receive valuable training in Behavior Management, Team-building Leadership, CPR and First Aid, and gain a confidence boost enabling them to stand up and take charge of a cabin full of campers! Youth who complete this weeklong program will receive a certificate of completion and be able to come back for a different week of camp to co-counsel, along with two Pilgrim Pines staff, in our Mini, Junior or Pinester programs.



Week 3: Creative Expressions

Get your creative juices flowing! Creative Expressions includes everything in the Sr. High Camp description and MORE! The week is facilitated by talented staff that encourage expression and learning through the arts—drama, poetry, music, dance, visual art and more!

Check In and Sunday BBQ

Registration takes place outside the dining hall where campers will meet their counselors and receive their cabin assignments.

Pinester, Pine Cone and Seedling check-in begins at 2 pm on Sunday.

Mini, Junior, Jr. High and Sr. High check-in begins at 3 pm on Sunday. A camp tour and parent meeting will be held between 4-5 pm in the Main Lodge.

Health Screening and Medications

Please be prepared to update any health or medication information with the camp nurse after the mandatory health screening. Medications must be brought to camp in their original containers, clearly marked with name, medication and dosage. Place all medications in a zip-seal bag, marked with the camper's name, camper's age group, and dates of camp.

Check Out

Pinester, Pine Cone and Seedling check out is at 10 am on FRIDAY morning.

Mini, Junior, Jr. High and Sr. High campers will check out separately at 10 am on Saturday morning.

LATE FEE: Please note that the person picking up the camper(s) after 11 am on Friday or Saturday, will be subject to a fee of \$25.00 per camper/per hour, due at the time of pickup.

Pilgrim Pines General Information

Campership Store: Pilgrim Pines t-shirts, sweatshirts, sundry items and a wide variety of camp related souvenirs are available at the campership store. All proceeds support our campership program. The camp store will be open on check-in and check-out days only. Please do **NOT** send any additional money with your campers.

Dress Code: Closed-toed shoes **MUST** be worn at all times. Pilgrim Pines is a mountain camp for children and youth of all ages. Clothing must be suitable for our mixed age groups and the outdoor environment. "Message" clothing conveying drugs, alcohol, cigarette ads or crude comments will not be tolerated at camp. Campers wearing clothing deemed by the director as inappropriate will be asked to change into appropriate clothing.

Visitors: are not allowed in camp during a camp session except by special permission of the Summer Camp Director.

Prohibited Items: Expensive jewelry, cameras, cell phones (which generally get no signal at camp), fireworks, pets, skateboards, open toed-shoes, alcoholic beverages, drugs, and food (brought or sent) are **NOT** allowed at camp. MP3 players, iPods, and personal sports equipment can be brought at your own risk and must be left in the cabin at all times. Please note: Cabins are not locked during the day.

Medications: must be turned into the camp nurse at registration. Over-the-counter or oral medication of any kind (including aspirin, ibuprofen, or acetaminophen, vitamins, etc.) will not be dispensed to minors without the express permission of the parent/guardian or attending physician. Permission may be authorized by a parent/guardian by signing the appropriate section at the bottom of the Health Form.

Parent/Guardian Notification (Accident/Sickness): The camp's insurance is a secondary coverage policy for emergency treatment of accidents and injuries only. Treatment required for camper illness is the responsibility of the camper's primary (parents/guardians) insurance. Should a camper become ill or injured during camp, parents/guardians will be notified by camp personnel, be advised of the situation, and appropriate care determined and implemented. **Parents/Guardians must be able to be contacted at all times during the week.**

Damage to Camp Property: Camper's parents/guardians will be held financially responsible for any and all damages to camp property.

Emergency Situations: Should there be an emergency situation, natural or otherwise, camp staff will implement our emergency plan and parents/guardians will be notified as soon as possible.

Registration and Payment



Registration and Payment

Registration is open until June 1, 2012 or until weeks are filled. For each week you wish to attend, please complete a **separate registration form, health form, medication form, camper profile, and ropes course/climbing wall release form**. We will not be able to register campers with incomplete forms so please make sure that each form is completely filled out with all the appropriate signatures. Send all forms with your full payment or \$100 non-refundable deposit per camper, per week, payable to Pilgrim Pines Camp and Conference Center. UCC members and returning campers are able to register beginning February 2012 and new campers are able to register beginning March 1 through June 1, 2012 or until weeks are filled. All campers are registered on a 'first come first served' basis. Space is limited, so please register early. All forms and at least the minimum deposit are **REQUIRED** in order to reserve a spot for your camper.

Phone reservations will **NOT** be accepted.

Step by Step Registration

1. Determine the camp week and program age group (Mini, Junior, etc.) for which you want to register.
2. Complete one Registration form, one Health form, one Medication form, one Camper Profile, one Ropes Course/ Climbing Wall release form and, if registering for the Pinester program, the corresponding Pinester forms for each week requested.
3. Enclose full payment or a minimum \$100 non-refundable deposit for each registration and send it with the completed forms to **Pilgrim Pines Camp and Conference Center, ATTN: Registrar, 39570 Glen Road, Yucaipa, CA, 92399**.
4. Send in any balance remaining so that it arrives at Pilgrim Pines 14 days before the first day of the week for which the camper is registered.

Cancellations and Refunds

Cancellations will be accepted until two weeks prior to the first day of the week the camper is registered. Cancellations will be granted a refund of the registration fee minus the \$100 deposit. There will be **NO** refunds for cancellations



Camperships and Financial Assistance

We want every potential camper to be able to have the privilege of attending Pilgrim Pines Camp and to experience the unique camping experience that only we offer. To accomplish this, we offer financial need-based Campership assistance at various levels to meet the fees associated with camp.

In 2011 we gave \$16,627 in Pilgrim Pines Camperships to assist campers to have the week of their lives at camp. Although we do have very generous donors who make so many Camperships available each year, funds are limited, so you are encouraged to seek alternative sources, such as your local church first, before applying with us.

Campership funds are awarded based on income requirements as outlined on the application form. Therefore, proof of income is required. If your family income exceeds the amount on the chart, no award can be given. Funds are limited and are not available to cover the minimum \$100 non-refundable deposit or the late fee if the registration forms are postmarked after June 1, 2012.

All families are required to pay a \$100 non-refundable deposit for each camper. The balance and any applicable late fees are due 14 days before camp starts. **Campership applications must be filled out and accompany camp registration forms.** Additional forms can be obtained on our website or by calling the camp office (see front cover for contact information).

The **Low Ropes Challenge** course is comprised of nine (9) elements that are used in developing group communication, teamwork, problem solving techniques, and trust among peers. Groups work together to set a goal and complete a team challenge on these ground level obstacles.

The **Climbing Tower/Zip Line**: 40 foot rock wall and "vertical playpen" - belayed/facilitated by trained staff.

The **High Ropes Challenge** course is comprised of seven (7) elements suspended 35 feet above the ground. The course incorporates creative problem solving, team and individual encouragement, trust among peers, and allows for youth to challenge themselves and to celebrate individual successes while building self-esteem. All participants wear safety gear, including a helmet and harness that is connected through a belay safety system.

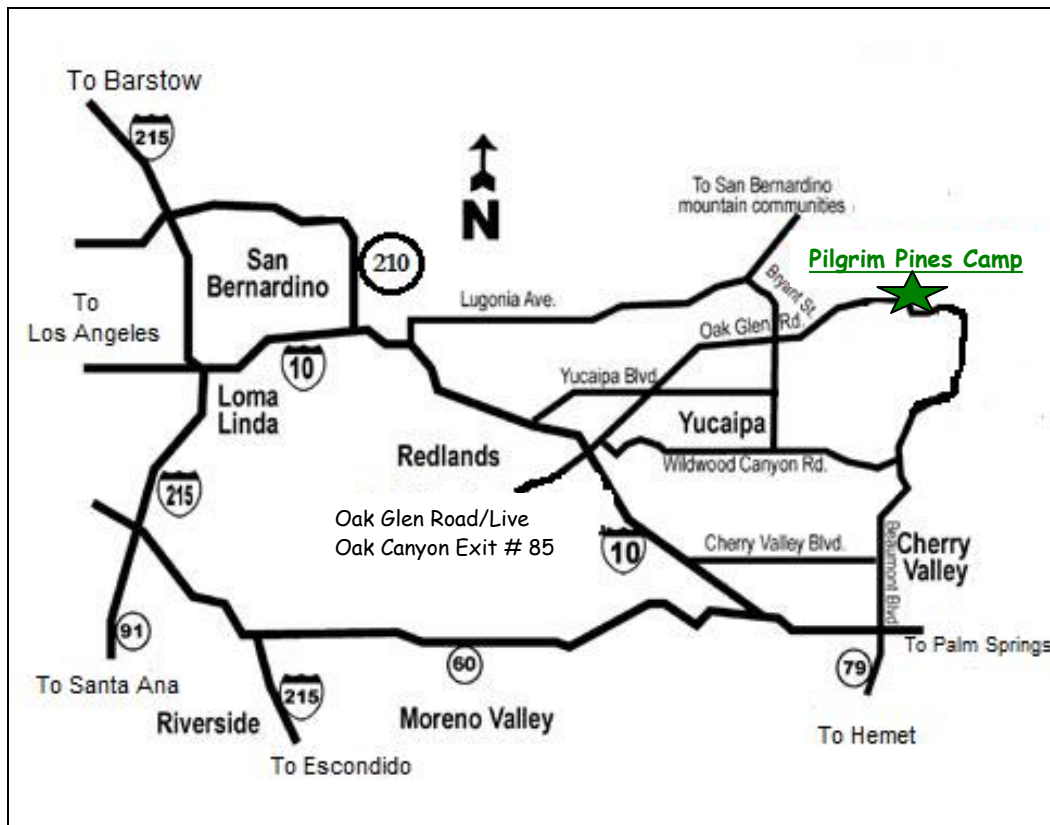

Driving Directions to Pilgrim Pines Camp



Where is Pilgrim Pines Camp?

Pilgrim Pines is located 16 miles East of Redlands on the southern slopes of the San Bernardino Mountains. 39570 Glen Road Yucaipa, CA 92399 (909) 797-1821 (Cell phone service is unavailable or very unreliable).

Traveling from WEST of Redlands: Drive EAST on the San Bernardino Freeway (I-10). Take exit # 85, Oak Glen Road/Live Oak Canyon. Turn LEFT at the end of the ramp and drive 10.6 miles on Oak Glen Road. Turn LEFT at the **Pilgrim Pines Camp** sign onto Glen Road. Drive up Glen Road and park in one of two lots on the left side.

Traveling from EAST of Redlands: Drive WEST on the San Bernardino Freeway (I-10). Follow the same directions as above EXCEPT turn RIGHT at the end of the Oak Glen Road/Live Oak Canyon exit # 85.

Bus and Train Station Directions: From the train station in San Bernardino take the (I-215) Freeway SOUTH towards Riverside. At the interchange take the San Bernardino Freeway (I-10) EAST. Continue to exit # 85 and follow the directions listed above. Total distance is 27 miles.

From the Ontario Airport: Take the San Bernardino Freeway (I-10) EAST to exit # 85. Proceed as listed above. Total distance is 42 miles.

From the Los Angeles International Airport (LAX): Go EAST on World Way/Center Way; merge onto S. Sepulveda Blvd./CA-1-S toward (I-105) – *if you are on W. Century Blvd. and reach Avion Dr. you've gone .4 miles too far.* Take the Imperial Hwy WEST/(I-105) ramp toward Imperial Terminal. Merge onto (I-105) toward Norwalk. Drive 17 miles and merge onto (I-10) EAST. Drive 54.2 miles to exit # 85 and follow the directions listed above. Total distance is 96 miles.

From Pasadena: Take the (I-210) Freeway EAST. Merge onto the (I-10) Freeway EAST in Redlands. Continue to exit # 85. Proceed as listed above. Approximately 77 miles from the Pasadena area.

From San Diego: Drive NORTH on (I-15). Merge onto the (I-215) NORTH towards Riverside/San Bernardino. Drive 34.9 miles and merge onto the (I-215) NORTH towards San Bernardino; travel 5.9 miles and merge onto (I-10) EAST towards Redlands. Take exit # 85, Oak Glen Road/Live Oak Canyon. Turn LEFT at the end of the ramp and drive 10.6 miles on Oak Glen Road. Turn LEFT at the **Pilgrim Pines Camp** sign onto Glen Road. Drive up Glen Road and park in one of two lots on the left side.
